**1. Apologies.**

**4. Matters arising.**

Michael Ferriter spoke to Mike Tagg at Woodbeck and there is no further progress as they are so short staffed. Dawn from Rampton Hospital was coming to the Woodbeck Open Evening, but she sent apologies the following day and explained she was ill. Sue spoke to her about the allocation of land and she was fine with this. Sue also explained, following the Rampton Community Forum, that there is an appraisal of the effectiveness and cost of the outside buildings.

Feasibility Study for Social Housing was discussed. To be left to the Council to explore further. Public consultation went well. No future tasks. Funding – there are no further funds, so we have no further funds to use if there are more expenses. The general feeling was that this was not likely to happen.

**5. Feedback from the Woodbeck consultation.**

Only two written responses, but they were very positive, plus some informal feedback which was also positive.

**6. Final draft of NP hopefully to be submitted to the Parish Council in November.**

Luke says it is not feasible to submit in November and the Consultation Period does not end until November. Luke also mentions the Strategic Environmental Assessment and the Habitat Assessment. This is Will's responsibility, and he has to do the report and consulting with the statutory authorities such as Heritage England. The plan can be completed and submitted, but the submission to Bassetlaw cannot be done until the SEA has been completed. The final polish can be done in good time if we submit in December after the Consultation period has ended. It just needs tweaking, there is the odd typo and some missing tables. Our internal editing should be completed by mid-November, say Nov 14<sup>th</sup>. The Council can consider it as a final draft which will just need the SEA report. Will says that the problem will lie with Historic England. It is very important to have a published draft which will give weight to the plan. It will have to be considered but will not have the full weight.
