

Meeting of the Rampton and Woodbeck Neighbourhood Plan Steering Committee

Held at Rampton Village Hall on 17th October, 2017.

Present: Mike Ferriter, Nick Easey, Rebecca Hunter, Sue Kyle, Peter Copeland, Lizzie Copeland, Caroline Dixon

The main purpose of the meeting to pass from Nick to Peter Copeland as Chair.

43 surveys were filled out and returned but it was felt that more were needed to gain a better consensus so the deadline was extended to 31st October.

Mike will compile data and analyse using database and have it ready before the next meeting.

Pete not going to change plan but asked Nick to outline how he sees it going.

Nick envisaged a 6-month initial consultation period then analysing data gleaned from that, then keeping the consultation process going and not leaving it long between periods of gleaning feedback and analysing it. People will be more interested and will potentially become more involved when it affects them directly so this dynamic will become clear when we specify the areas considered for development. We have to allocate land and will use the regular feedback to make a decision on this. We will begin another public consultation early in 2018. We need to ascertain themes such as utilities, services for example. Then we need to rewrite a more in-depth survey and identify potential spaces then seek opinion on those. We need to use the funding by 1st February or return it if we have not used it. We will also need to apply for next round of funding early February. So far it looks as if there is not space for 70 houses. There might need to be a compromise between small number of large houses and dense areas of population.

Money £2855.88 we have to spend by end of 6 months (1st February 2018) or it has to be returned.

Luke's bill in that 6-month period will account for £2800 of the funding.

Nick has so far used £1239.12 of the budget for survey forms, and banners, hall hire, catering, promotion, publicising open events and some of this has been for Luke Brown Consultancy. Luke gets us a bulk rate for printing by using the service available at Bassetlaw District Council.

Prize draw still to be videoed and put up on Facebook.

We need to cajole people to come forward with completed forms.
