Vestry Book/Parish Meeting Book	Book	1834 to 1911	This book covers the vestry meeting minutes, accounts and annual parish meeting minutes before Parish Councils were introduced in 1894, it also covered church matters. In 1894 parish councils and Parochial Church councils were created which took over the church and non church aspects of these matters. In later years the accounts stopped being record in this book and into the 'White' book accounts book.
Allotment Committee Payments & Receipts Account Book	Medium Blue	28/03/1978 - 28/11/1980	The Allotments were on Retford Road in between the road and Forest Garden Field at the rear of the Allotments. The Allotments fell in to disuse in the early 1980's and the Parish Council reorganised them so they were rented to Mr E Quickfall in 1983, who also rents Forest Garden Field, this then amalgamated the two into one larger Forest Garden Field for crops, there are no allotments in Rampton anymore.

There is also an expired lease for the village bus stop, which was built in 1956, the lease ran until 1981 but in the intervening years the bus stop was adopted by the County Council who now own it but the lease is a historical document you can have.
